Introduction


Student Satisfaction Survey (SSS) is structured with 21 questions in Google form designed by the IQAC of Govt .Rajmata Vijaya Raje Sindhiya Kanya Mahavidyalaya, Kawardha, and administered among the students through online by sending-

Students can access the SSS 24/7 on any of their devices or Computer labs in the college. The thrust area of questions range from curriculum, Teaching - Learning process, Evaluation procedures emphasizing on the teaching methods and procedures adopted. These questions are scaled on a five-point scale. "0" is the least grade while 4 is the highest grade.

The last 21st question is an open end question eliciting the student's observation or suggestions for further enhancement of their satisfaction. During the year 2023-24, the SSS was conducted for all 4UG, 2 PG (Computer Science & Chemistry) and 1 PGDCA programs and analyzed by IQAC in coordination with Physics and commerce department. Preliminary Analysis on the SSS received as follows:

A total of 114 responses were collected of which 5.3 percent 1st year students, 43 percent 2nd year students 37.7 percent students from 3rd year participated, 2.6 percent from 1st sem students, 3.5 percent from IInd semester students and 7.9 percent from IIIrd semester students. Stream wise analysis projects that of the total 114 responses 50 percent submitted by science stream students, 33.3 percent by Arts stream students 0.9 percent by commerce stream students and 15.8 percent by M.Sc. chemistry stream students.






Analysis:

Q(1)-How much of the syllabus was covered in the class?


Analysis: 19.3 percent Students responded that 85-100 percent syllabus is covered, 40.4 percent Students responded that 70-84 percent syllabus is covered, 14 percent Students responded That 55-69 percent syllabus is covered, 19.3 percent Students responded that 30-54 percent syllabus is covered while 7 percent of the students responded that below 30 percent Syllabus is covered.


Q(2)-How well did the teachers prepare for the classes?

Analysis: 42.1percent students responded thoroughly preparation for class by faculty,42.1percent Students responded satisfactory, 4.4 responded poor, 0.9 responded indifferently while none of the student expressed won't teach at all.



Q(3)-How well were the teachers able to communicate?


Analysis: 57.9 percent of students expressed that the teacher's communication was always effective, 22.8percent felt sometimes teacher's communication ability was sometimes effective,11.4percent felt just satisfactorily,5.3percent felt generally ineffective while only 2.6 percent students felt that teacher's communication is very poor.



Q(4)-The teacher's approach to teaching can best be described as-


Analysis: 29.8 percent of the students rated excellent and 47.4 percent rated as very good, 19.3

percent of the students rated good ,2.6 percent of the students rated fair while 0.9 of the student rated as poor.




$\mathbf{Q}(5)\text{-}\mathbf{Fairness}$ of the internal evaluation process by the teachers.




Q(6)-Was your performance in assignments discussed with you?




- Q(7)- The institute takes active interest in promoting internship, student exchange, and field visit Opportunities for students.


Q(8)-The teaching and mentoring process in your institution facilitates you in cognitive, social and Emotional growth.


Q(9)- The institution provides multiple opportunities tolearn and grow.

Q(10)- Teachers inform you about your expected competencies, course outcomes and programme outcomes.




Q(11)-Your mentor does a necessary follow-up with an assigned task to you.




Q(12)-The teachers illustrate the concepts through examples and applications.

Analysis: 55.3 percent students expressed that every time the teacher illustrate the concepts through examples and applications ,25.4 percent expressed usually,13.2 percent students opted occasionally and 4.4 percent marked rarely and 1.8 of them marked never.




- Q(13)-The teachers identify your strengths and encourage you with providing right level of challenges.




Q(14)-Teachers are able to identify your weaknesses and help you to overcome them.




- Q(15)-The institution makes effort to engage students in the monitoring ,review and continuous Quality improvement of the teaching learning process.


Q(16)- The institute/ teachers use student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies for enhancing learning Experiences.




Q(18)- Efforts are made by the institute/teachers to inculcate soft skills, life skills and Employability skills to make you ready for the world of work.



Q(19)- What percentage of teachers use ICT tools such as LCD projector, Multimedia, etc. while teaching.



Q(21)- Open-end question for suggestions:


